Janet Reilly	New Web Site	<p>Due to a potential shortage of Tb screening materials (Tb Antigen (Tubersol and Aplisol) students have had difficulty meeting the health requirements currently in place. The alternate product, QuantiFERON, is costly for students - \$300 -\$400. The CDC and State of Wisconsin Tb Program has supported the use of a risk based TB screening questionnaire in lieu of screening antigen. Since not all sites accept the screening tool, the comment will be added to the Healthcare Requirements document:</p> <p>*October 2013 - Due to the potential shortage of Tb screening materials (Tb Antigen, specifically Tubersol and Aplisol]), <i>some</i> clinical sites mayaccept the Wisconsin Tuberculosis Program Risk Based TB Screening Questionnaire (Nov., 2012). Instructors will need to work directly with clinical sites if a student to be placed has requested an exemption to getting the flu vaccine.	Information
